Infrastructure Facility

In the month of October, Anti-Narcotic cell conducted a college competition in which an enthusiastic participation from the students were seen.

NSS Unit – The NSS activities are aimed at imparting a sense of involvement among the students for the task of nation building. One week residential camp was conducted under the leadership of Navas sir during the Christmas holidays. Annual athletic meet – The annual sports meet of our college was held on 20th 2018 in our college ground. Great interest and participations were observed among the students. Honourable I M Vijayan was the chief guest of the occasion. On that occasion he inaugurated the new playground.

Christmas and New Year celebration – On 22nd December the students and staff together with the management celebrated Christmas and New Year with Christmas Carol. Our Provincial Superior Fr. Saji Muthirenthikkal delivered Christmas message to students and staff.
