On 15th October 2025, as part of the Mental Health Week celebrations, the PG Department of Psychology inaugurated a Listening Corner in the college to promote emotional well-being and peer support. The initiative provided a safe, non-judgmental space where students could freely share their thoughts and feelings. Through empathetic listening and guided reflection by trained psychology students, the Listening Corner encouraged openness, reduced stigma around seeking help, and enhanced awareness about mental health. The initiative received positive feedback from participants, fostering a culture of compassion, connection, and psychological safety within the campus community.



On 15th October 2025, as part of the Mental Health Week celebrations, the PG Department of Psychology inaugurated a departmental music band - PSYMPHONY to promote emotional expression and mental well-being through music. The initiative aimed to provide students with a creative and therapeutic outlet to relieve stress and foster a sense of unity and joy. The band encouraged collaboration, self-expression, and positive engagement among students, highlighting the role of music as a medium for healing and connection. The event received enthusiastic participation and appreciation, creating an atmosphere of vibrancy and togetherness within the campus community.



On 17th November 2025, the PG Department of Psychology conducted a visit to Akashaparava, an old age home, as part of the department's experiential learning activities. Students interacted with the residents, observed caregiving practices, and gained deeper insight into the psychological aspects of ageing. DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

Academic and Extension Activities (September–November 2025–26)







Malappuram, Kerala, India





The Department of Social Work organized a wide range of academic, field-based, and extension programmes during the months of September to November 2025 as part of the academic year 2025–26, with the aim of strengthening professional competencies, research orientation, and social responsibility among MSW students.

As part of World Suicide Prevention Day, the department, in collaboration with CHL Hospital, Kumbidi, conducted an awareness programme on 10th September 2025. The programme focused on early warning signs of suicide and community-based prevention strategies. Expert talks were delivered by clinical psychologists and psychiatric social workers, followed by an interactive discussion with MSW students. The students also presented a mime programme, which effectively conveyed the message of mental health awareness and suicide prevention.

A one-day Research Methodology Workshop was conducted on 11th September 2025 to equip students with essential research skills. The session was led by Dr. Aneesh Kurian, Head, Department of Social Work, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Devagiri, Calicut. The workshop included hands-on training on research problem formulation, conceptual framework preparation, and development of data collection tools. The programme significantly enhanced students' confidence in undertaking PG dissertations and professional research projects.

As part of the curriculum, Third Semester MSW students undertook a National Study Visit to Hyderabad, visiting reputed organizations such as the Catholic Health Association of India, Pinnacle Autism Therapy, Terminate Hunger, Fathima Old Age Home, and Smile Foundation India. These organizations work in the fields of healthcare, community development, child protection, rehabilitation, and social welfare. The visit proved to be an enriching learning experience that broadened students' professional perspectives and practical understanding.

During the Third Semester, MSW students specializing in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work and Community Development completed their field work training in renowned institutions including NIMHANS, Bengaluru; SCARF, Chennai; Chaitanya Institute for Mental Health, Pune; Louise Mount Hospital, Wayanad; Santhula Hospital, Ernakulam;

Kasturba Hospital, Manipal; and Native Medicare Charitable Trust, Coimbatore. This extensive field exposure strengthened students' clinical competencies and enhanced their understanding of biopsychosocial approaches in mental health care.

First Semester MSW students completed their concurrent field work with the Kerala Solid Waste Management Project and Kerala Suchitwa Mission, where they were placed in various municipalities and panchayats of Malappuram district. The training focused on developing foundational skills such as observation, client interaction, communication, documentation, need assessment, and understanding organizational functioning. Students also assisted in awareness campaigns and surveys, helping them build a strong orientation towards professional social work practice.

The department also organized a Workshop on Statistical Methods in Social Work Research on 5th November 2025, led by Mr. Unnikrishnan V. B., Assistant Professor, Department of Economics, St. Mary's College, Puthanangadi. The workshop covered descriptive and inferential statistics, measures of central tendency, correlation, chi-square tests, and t-tests. The session enhanced students' confidence in handling quantitative data for research and field-based studies.

MSW students actively participated in national and international seminars and conferences during this period. Twenty students presented research papers at the Two-Day International E-Conference on "Innovations for a Sustainable Future: Bridging Science, Society and Policy", held on 17th and 18th October 2025, organized by St. Mary's College, Puthanangadi, in association with Catholic University Our Lady of Good Counsel, Tirana, Albania. Additionally, Mr. Arun Raj T. and Ms. Fathima Nujoom, First Year MSW students, presented a paper at the 10th Kerala Social Work Students Congress held at BCM College, Kottayam, on 7th November 2025. These participations significantly contributed to strengthening the research culture of the department.

Further strengthening academic collaborations, the Department of Social Work signed Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) in November 2025 with Christ College (Autonomous), Irinjalakuda, and St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Devagiri, Calicut. These partnerships aim to promote academic exchange, collaborative learning, and enriched platforms for field-based social work engagement.

Overall, the department's activities during this period reflect its strong commitment to academic excellence, professional training, research development, and social responsibility, ensuring holistic development of MSW students.

Nature Club Newsletter Report

NSS Volunteers' Visit to Akashaparavalal, Vettathoor



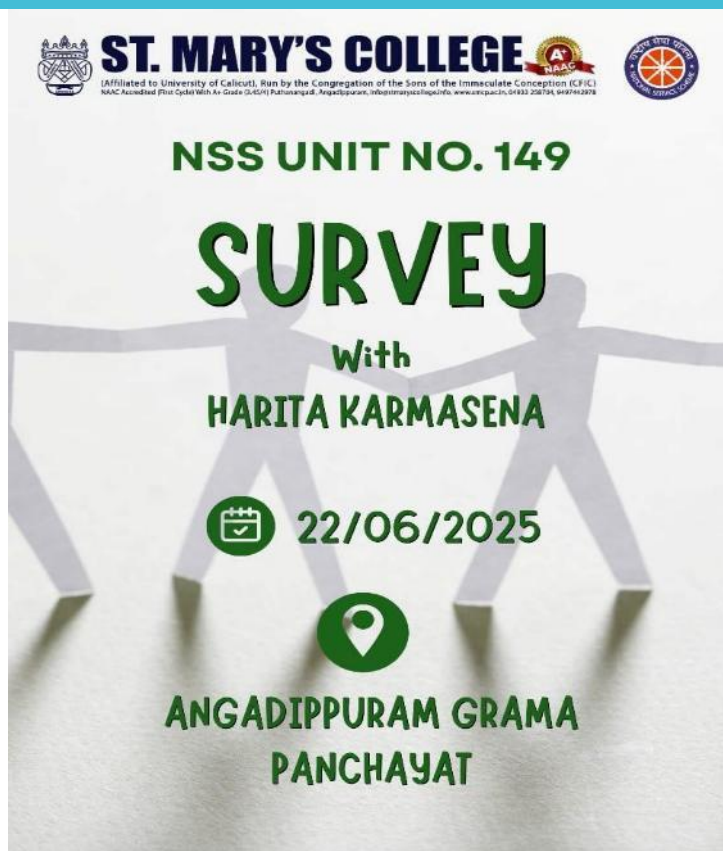
