# **DEPARTMENT PROGRAMS**

## DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY



To nurture creativity, leadership, teamwork and problem-solving skills among students, the Department of Chemistry conducted a series of extracurricular programmes in our college.

On **December 15, 2025**, an orientation titled “**Orientation for internship programme for FYUGP students**” was conducted for the second year chemistry students. The session was resourced by **SOWMYA V AND FARISAMOL V S**, STC trainers, CIPET, Ottappalam. The session mainly aimed and delivered introduction to various internship programmes offered by Central Institute of Plastics Engineering and Technology, Ottappalam for BSc. Chemistry honours students. They also enrolled our students in their summer internship programme.



The Department of Chemistry and Psychology conducted a combined study tour to DANDELI- GOA on 13-12-2025 to 17/12/2025 with 37 students and four faculties. We started our journey on 13/12/2025 at 12: 30 pm in a bus and reached Dandeli on 14/12/2025 at 9 am. The whole day we spent at Dandeli doing different kinds of water sports. On 15/12/2025, we went to Goa from Dandeli for two days sightseeing.

Dandeli, a small town in the Western Ghats of Karnataka, India, is a popular ecotourism and adventure destination known for its lush tropical forest, diverse wildlife and the Kali River. It is an adventure sports destination, and a white-water rafting destination in South India. It is one of the few locations where rafting is possible even in peak summer months of March to June. Dandeli also offers many other adventure activities like Kayaking, Zorbing, Jungle safari, River crossing ziplines etc.

Goa is a popular tourist destination in the south western coast of India within the Konkan region known for its beaches, culture, and natural beauty. Goa is a blend of Indian and Portuguese cultures, with colorful architecture, lush greenery, and a vibrant nightlife. Major tourist attractions include Bom Jesus Basilica, Fort Aguada, Fort Chapora, Baga beach. The Churches and Convents of Goa have been declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.



The department of Chemistry, St. Mary's college Puthanangadi conducted a career guidance session titled as 'Opportunities at IISc' on 06/02/2026. Rev.Fr. Dr. Denny Cholappallil inaugurated the program and Mrs. Sneha K P, Asst. Professor, department of chemistry coordinated the programe. The session was handled by Dr. Durga Prasad Hari, Assistant professor, Department of Organic chemistry, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore. 43 students from chemistry departments benefitted from the program. The session mainly focused on attaining higher education in chemistry field and job oppertuinitities.Orientation was highly thought provoking.





The department of chemistry, St. Mary's college Puthanangadi conducted an industrial visit for second year BSc Chemistry (Honours) students on 09/02/2026 at ICAR- Indian Institute of Spices Research, Kozhikode. The visit lasted approximately 3 hours and our students got to know about various extraction processes of compounds from different spices and also got to witness the instrumentations such as PCR systems, protein profile probe, HPLC, gas chromatography, refractometer etc. They also witnessed production units for entrepreneurs and different types of extracted samples. The visit was highly appreciable as they experienced practical understanding of chemical processes.



## DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE



### HUMAN RIGHTS DAY programme

The Department of Political Science organised a Students' Seminar on 19/12/2025 in connection with the observance of International Human Rights Day. The programme aimed to create awareness among students about the importance of human rights in contemporary society. Students actively participated and presented papers on current and relevant issues such as manual scavenging, data privacy in the digital age, and LGBTQ+ rights. These presentations highlighted ongoing human rights challenges and emphasised the need for legal, social, and policy-based solutions. The seminar encouraged critical thinking and meaningful academic discussion, thereby enhancing students' understanding of human rights and their role in promoting equality, dignity, and social justice.



### TOUR PROGRAM

The Department of Political Science, St. Mary's College, Puthanangadi, successfully organized a seven-day educational study tour to Delhi, Agra, and Jaipur from 15th December 2025 to 22nd December 2025. The tour aimed to provide students with practical exposure to India's political institutions, constitutional functioning, and historical governance systems. During the visit, students explored significant political and heritage sites, gaining deeper insight into the country's democratic framework and historical evolution. The program enhanced students' academic understanding, encouraged experiential learning, and strengthened their awareness of India's political and cultural heritage, making the study tour both informative and enriching.



### INSTITUTIONAL VISIT: IDUKKI

As part of experiential learning and extension initiatives, the Department of Political Science organized an institutional visit to the Idukki Wildlife Division and the Kolumban Tribal Settlement from 6th to 8th February 2026. The visit aimed to provide students with first-hand exposure to issues related to environmental governance, forest administration, tribal rights, and sustainable development. During the program, students interacted with forest officials and members of the tribal community to understand policies concerning conservation, livelihood, displacement, and community participation in resource management. The field-based learning experience enabled students to connect theoretical concepts in political science with ground realities, thereby strengthening their understanding of public policy implementation, indigenous rights, and ecological sustainability. The visit significantly contributed to enhancing students' social awareness, research orientation, and civic responsibility beyond the classroom.



### SOFTSKILL PROGRAM

The Department of Political Science organized a Soft Skill Development program titled “English Communicate in Better Way” on 20 January 2026 at 12:00 PM in the S6 Classroom. The session was handled by Ms. Anjana P, Assistant Professor, Department of English, St. Mary’s College, Puthanagadi. ### ASSOCIATION DAY PROGRAM

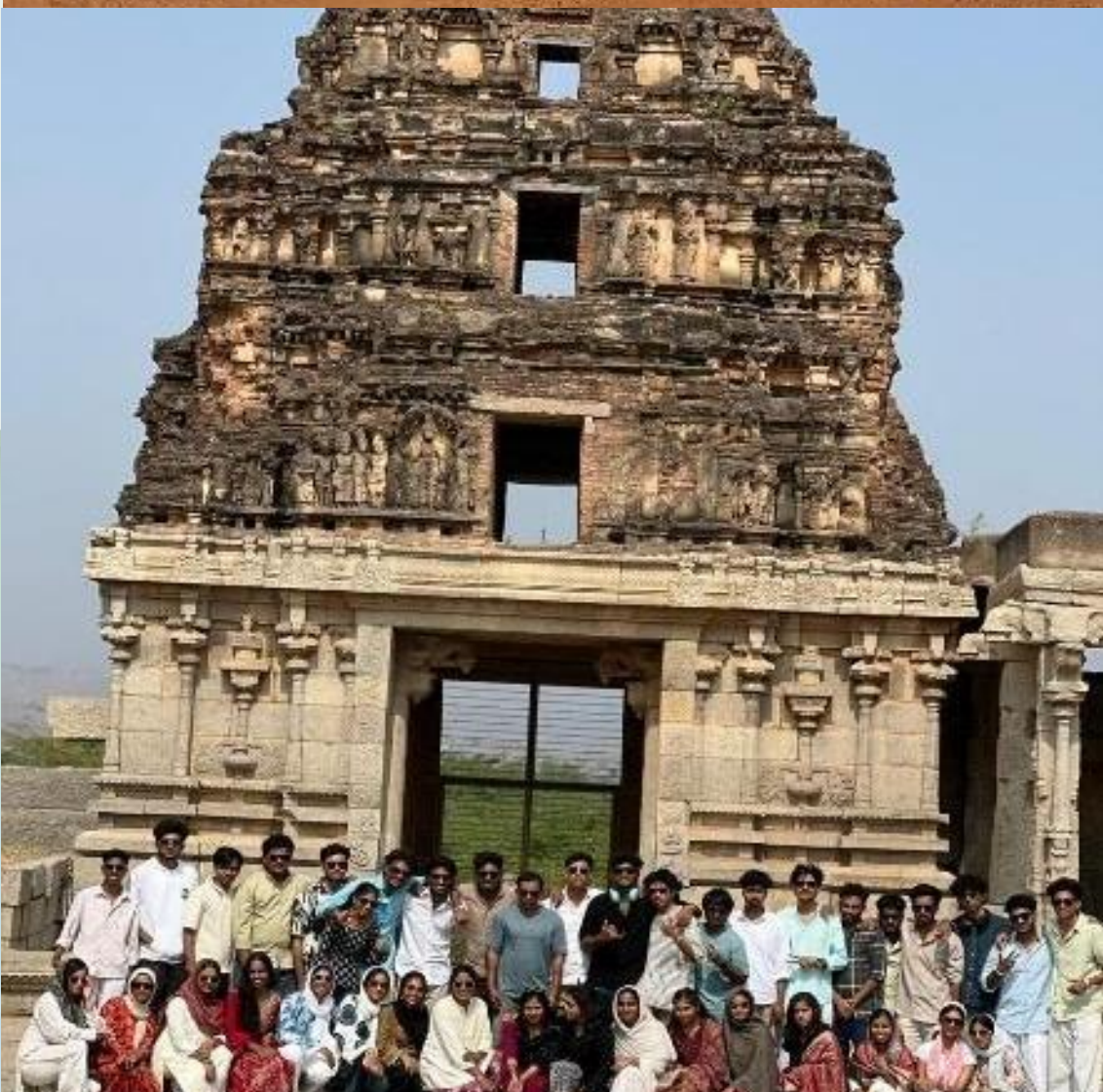

The conference aimed to critically examine the changing dynamics of family life in the digital and hyper-connected era, with special reference to Generation C (Connected Generation) and its implications for social work theory and practice. The e-conference witnessed active participation from academicians, research scholars, social work practitioners, and students from various institutions across India. A total of 23 research papers were presented during the conference.



**Fourth Semester MSW Students’ Fieldwork in Medical/Health Care/Community Development Settings:** As per the curriculum requirements, fourth semester MSW students were placed for their fieldwork according to their specialization in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work and Community Development settings from 2nd February 2026 to 28th February 2026. Students specializing in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work were placed at St. John’s Medical College, Bengaluru; National Institute of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Thrissur; Malabar Cancer Centre, Thalassery; IQRAA Hospital, Calicut; and Believers Church Medical College Hospital, Thiruvalla. Students specializing in Community Development Social Work were placed in Madurai, Tamil Nadu.

**Participation and Paper Presentations in Conferences:** MSW students participated in and presented research papers at various international and national conferences. Our faculty members and students also attended national conferences at Vimala College (Autonomous), Thrissur, and St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Devagiri, Calicut.

PG DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

**Hands-On Workshop on LED Bulb Assembling and Repair**

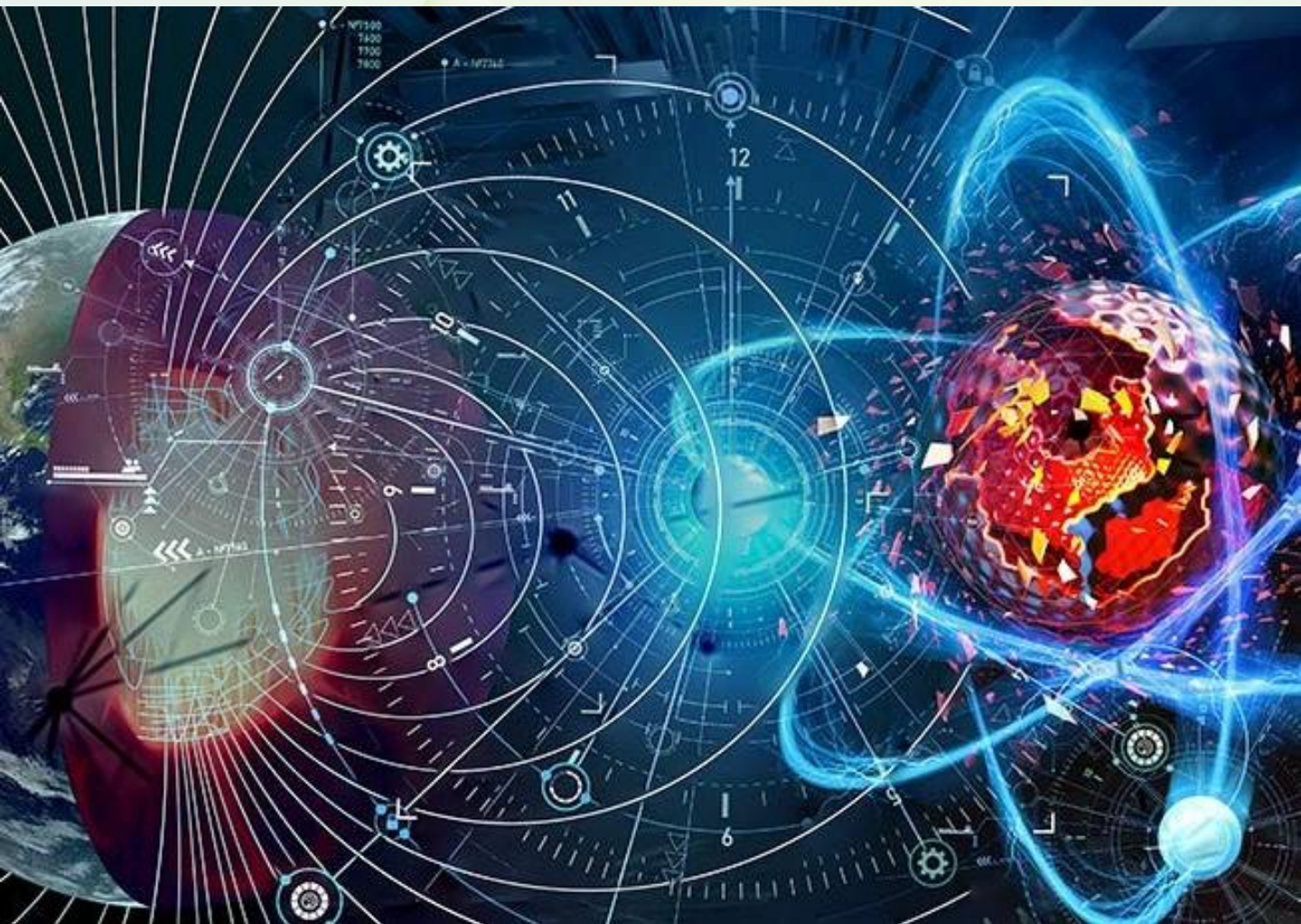

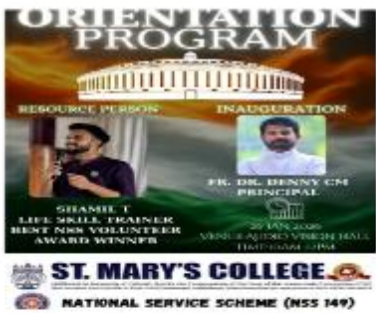
