

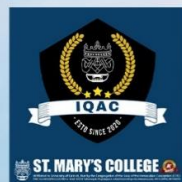

## DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY







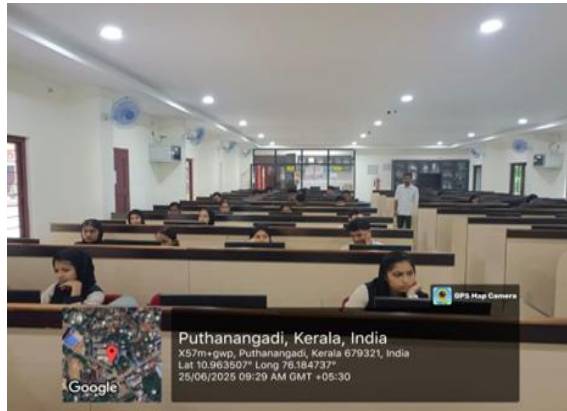

## POSTGRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH







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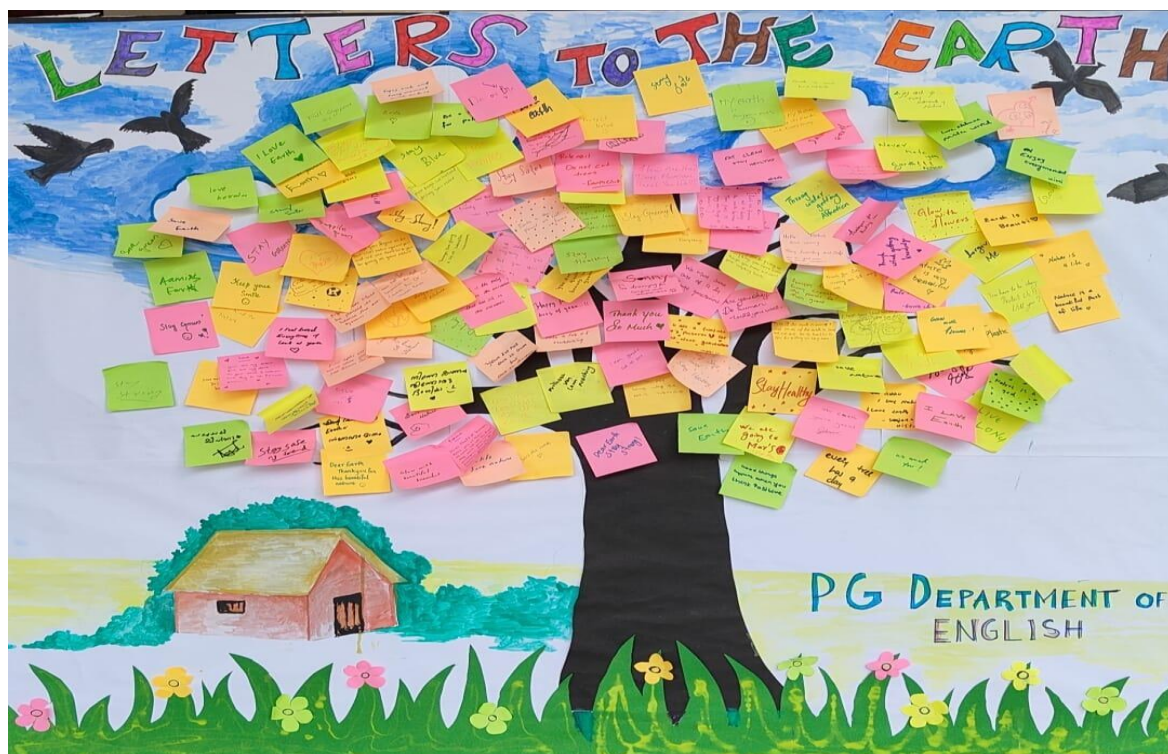

As part of its commitment to promoting awareness and holistic development, the Nature Club organized two major programs during June–July 2025.

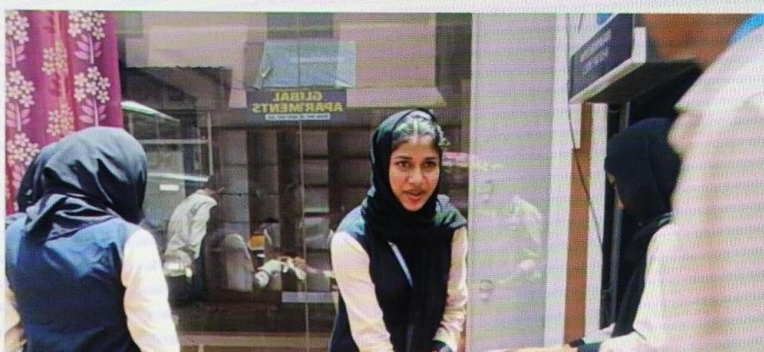
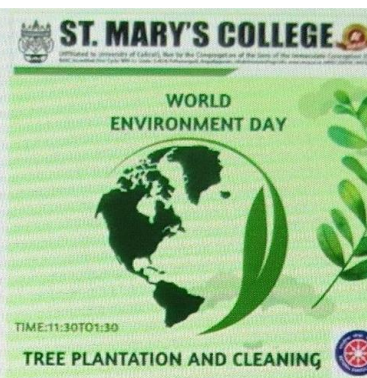

## PLACEMENT CELL

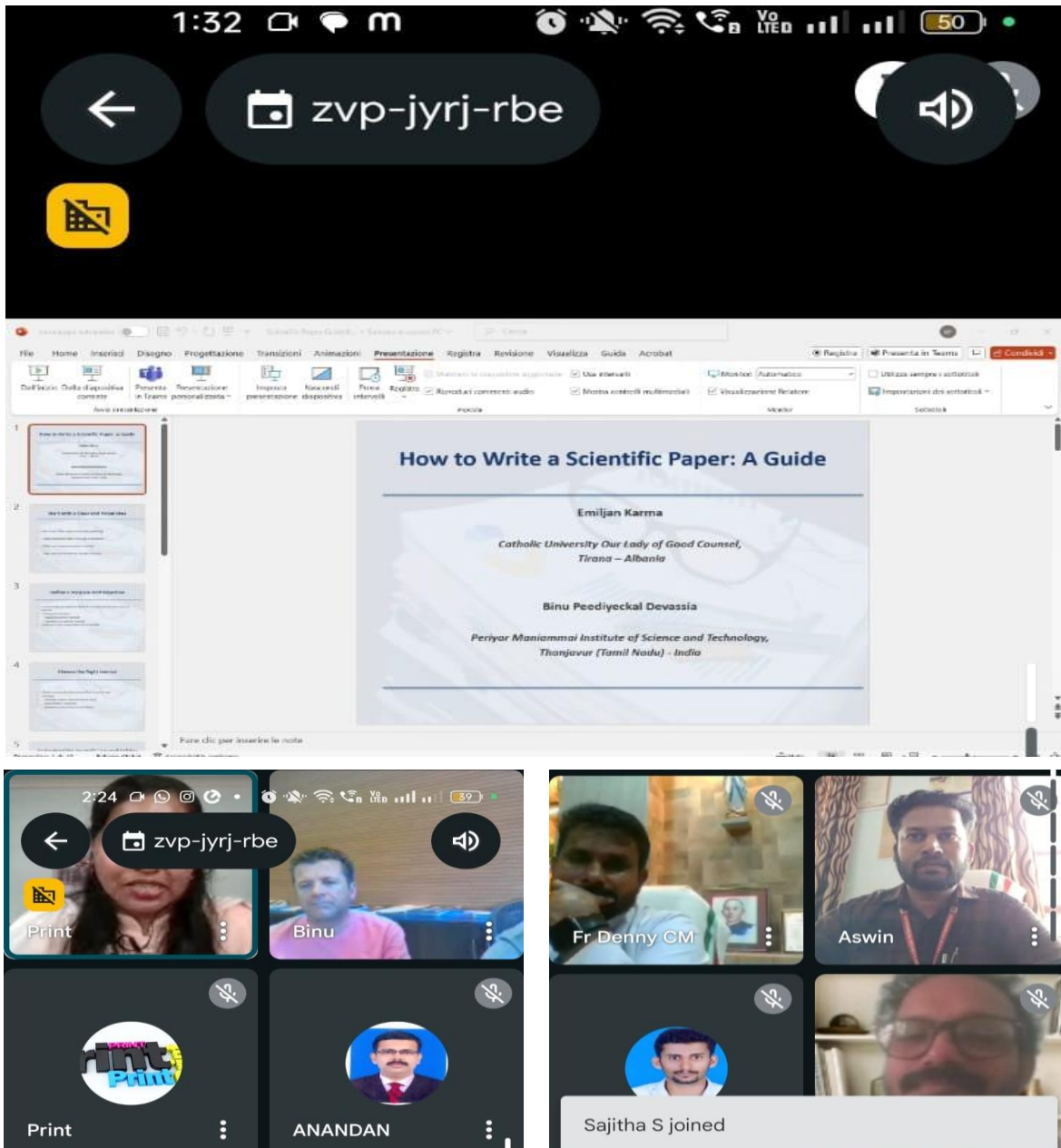

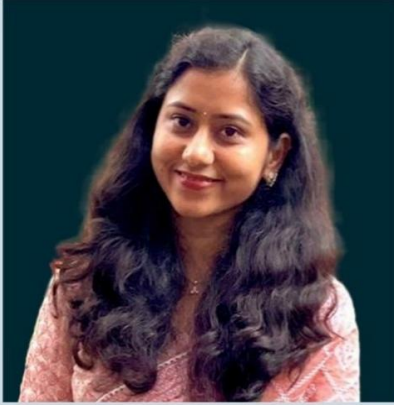
